

Assistant/Associate Professor of Special Education

Baldwin Wallace University seeks applicants for a full-time, tenure track position in Mild/Moderate Educational Needs in the School of Education, effective in the 2018-19 academic year. The position includes teaching in the undergraduate and graduate mild/moderate programs during the 9-month academic year. Participation in the graduate mild/moderate summer program is also expected with commensurate over-load payment. Responsibilities may include coordination of this summer practicum experience on a rotating basis.

We are seeking candidates with a passion for and commitment to special education for children and adolescents. They will join a community of equally committed teacher-scholars who see their role in preparing the next generation of teachers as both a privilege and a tremendous responsibility. The School of Education at Baldwin Wallace is known for balancing its rigorous and comprehensive preparation programs with innovative approaches and personal attention to its students. The School enrolls approximately 80 mild/moderate majors and graduate candidates. The undergraduate program leads to an Ohio initial intervention specialist license; the graduate program to a second license. The graduate program includes both on-campus and on-line offerings. Baldwin Wallace University is a teaching first institution, with a 21 credit hour instructional load per year. Tenure track positions also include *academic advising* of undergraduate students, *scholarly productivity* in the field of education, and *service* to the School, University, and community.

Qualifications: An earned doctorate in special education and at least three years of full-time, K-12 teaching experience in a special educator role is required. Previous college teaching experience is preferred, as is supervisory experience in special education. Preference will be given to candidates with experience or training in teaching in an on-line environment.

The search committee will begin reviewing applications immediately and continue until the position is filled. Send: a) letter of application, b) curriculum vitae, c) statement of teaching philosophy, d) evidence of teaching effectiveness, such as course or teaching evaluations, and e) contact information for three current references.
