Required Qualifications:

The candidate will have:

- an earned doctoral degree, in Education or a related field,
- a record of accomplishment in teaching, scholarship, and service,
- strong communication skills,
- demonstrated excellence in administration,
- experience working in both undergraduate and graduate licensure and non-licensure programs,
- experience and understanding of innovative delivery methods for programs offered online, onsite and at extended sites,
- knowledge of state and national accreditation,
- strong organizational skills,
- collaborative skills in working with faculty from related departments, as well as with other Schools,
- demonstrated ability to foster K-12 partnerships, and
- knowledge, experience and demonstrated success integrating inclusive excellence into the educational experience.

Preferred Qualifications:

The candidate will have an understanding and experience with higher education marketing, especially a market awareness for external sites, enrollment trends, both fundraising and grant writing, and online teaching.

Responsibilities:

The School of Education Dean reports to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and will work with him/her to ensure the quality of all academic offerings of the College. The Dean will be responsible for academic administration of all undergraduate and graduate programs in education and will assume the faculty roles of teaching, scholarship, and service. He/she must be a strong faculty and student advocate; skilled in establishing the strategic direction of the School and supporting the strategic direction of the College.

The College of St. Scholastica, founded in 1912, is a vibrant, growing independent private Catholic college located in Duluth, MN. With a broad range of offerings in the liberal arts and sciences and the professions, St. Scholastica offers bachelor's, master's, and professional doctoral degrees.
