

Minnesota State University Moorhead is seeking a tenure track **Assistant Professor of Elementary Education.**

- Teach Elementary Education courses. The incumbent would be expected to teach courses that would include but are not limited to Elementary Science Methods.
- Instruct courses in varied locations, at varied times, and via various media commensurate with department and university needs.
- Engage in scholarly research or creative achievement to enhance knowledge of field.
- Provide evidence of continuing preparation and study in the field to enhance teaching abilities.
- Contribute to student growth and development including student advising.
- Support Minnesota State University Moorhead's strategic priority of creating a campus community that is diverse, inclusive, globally aware, and just.
- Develop and deliver innovative and engaging curriculum that aligns with teacher licensure standards.
- Contribute to the School of Teaching and Learning through collaboration and activities related to accreditation, licensing, programmatic work, and other departmental needs.
- Supervise students in field-based settings.

Required Qualifications

- Earned doctorate in Elementary Education, Curriculum and Instruction, Educational Leadership, or closely related field by date of hire.
- Minimum three years full time teaching experience in K-6 classroom settings.
- Potential to effectively teach undergraduate teacher education courses in elementary science methods, and education technology or trauma-informed practices.
- Demonstrated commitment to quality teaching and mentorship of undergraduate students.
- Demonstrated ability to work with diverse populations including being sensitive to their academic and social needs.
- Possess leadership potential and willingness to lead initiatives, establish collaborative partnerships, and foster campus presence in the region.
- Research interests in and demonstrated commitment to scholarly activity that furthers teaching and learning with emphasis on social justice and equity.
- Must meet Higher Learning Commission [HLC] faculty credentialing guidelines [e.g. have 18 graduate credit hours in the discipline (education) the faculty is teaching.
